The System of Care Academy Planning Committee invites you to submit a presentation proposal for Kentucky's seventh annual System of Care Academy. The 2020 Academy attendees will include primary care providers, clinicians, prevention specialists, educators, child care providers, Family Resource & Youth Service Center staff, juvenile justice staff, family and juvenile services staff, community-based services staff, child welfare staff, public health staff, families, youth, interested community members, and people with lived experience.

To ensure diverse representation, we invite individuals and organizations from a variety of settings – including academia, non-profit, private sector, government agencies, healthcare systems, and provider agencies – to submit proposals for presentations focused on improving the system of care, improving policies, workforce development, original research or significant accomplishments in the field, including new frameworks, conceptual models, and methodological approaches related to strengthening Kentucky's families.

Selection Criteria

The planning committee will review proposals using the following criteria:

- Topic and objectives support and are reflective of SOC values and principles (see page 3)
- Unique and exciting content that reflects our dynamic community
- Relevant sessions that will be of great interest to attendees and would clearly benefit attendees
- Sessions designed with clear, measurable, and achievable learning objectives
- Demonstrates strong outcomes
- Inspires attendees to return to their community and implement what they learn
- Learning opportunities that meet the highest standards of excellence

All proposals must be complete, comprehensive, deemed relevant and timely, and clearly aligned with the SOC framework (see page 3).

System of Care (SOC) is defined as "a

spectrum of effective, community- based services and supports for children and youth with or at risk for behavioral health or other challenges and their families, that is organized into a coordinated network, builds meaningful partnerships with families and youth, and addresses their cultural and linguistic needs, in order to help them to function better at home, in school, in the community, and throughout life."

The **Core Values** support all SOC efforts in being youth- and family-driven; community-based; culturally- and linguistically-appropriate; trauma-informed; and recovery-oriented.

The **Guiding Principles** of the SOC support children, youth, and families in having access to:

- A comprehensive array of effective, community-based services and supports.
- A service planning process that is strength-based and individualized.
- Evidence-informed and promising practices.
- Services and supports that are delivered in the least restrictive, most normative environments possible.
- Partnerships with families and youth.
- Effective care management supports.
- Developmentally appropriate services.
- A continuum of behavioral health promotion, prevention, early identification, intervention, and recovery services and supports.
- A system that supports provider accountability and quality improvement tracking.
- Protection of their rights.
- Services and supports that are provided without discrimination.
